**Today's liturgical feast** has been on the Church calendar for about one hundred years, often on different dates. It is a "devotional" or "idea" feast that was inaugurated by Holy Family associations. Everything we know about the Holy Family, which is not much, comes from the Gospel accounts read over the three years. It celebrates the unity and love of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus.



**Simeon's prayer** in today's Gospel is called the Canticle of Simeon or the *Nunc dimittis*. This is the proper Gospel canticle for night prayer (or Compline) and has been an invariable part of the Liturgy of the Hours since about the fourth century. Just as the elderly Simeon could face death with peace because he knew he had seen the Messiah so, too, when we sing this canticle every night before retiring can we sleep peacefully in the confidence that God will see us through the night, since the terrors of darkness were dispelled when the Light came into the world. It is a wonderful habit to pray this prayer of confidence in God each night.
