Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord proclaims a theophany, a revelation, or a manifestation of the divine Son-ship of Jesus by his anointing to this messianic office. It is the feast that proclaims the Baptism that elevates believers to the status of sons and daughters of God.

Between today's feast and Ash Wednesday, we celebrate the weekdays and Sundays of Ordinary Time. Deep into winter in the Northern Hemisphere, many of us experience respite from the hustle and bustle of Christmas and New Year. We return to the routine marked by school and work timetables, as well as family activities. This year, the period of time between the End of Christmas Time and the beginning of Lent is relatively brief. Five Sundays in Ordinary Time, five weeks and the beginning of a sixth, provide us with an interim period during which we can reflect on the origins of our call to be a follower of Christ and what accepting that call means for the way we live in the world.

White Flower Appeal-The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) will be holding its annual appeal this weekend.
