Lenten gospels and baptism: Like many parishes, we have implemented the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). The season of Lent is the time for those preparing for Easter baptism, of increased reflection and coming nearer to God. A period is to do away with what is weak and sinful, and establish what is holy. Today we undertake a number of rites, this Sunday is the occasion for the first scrutiny and the presentation of the Creed. The scrutinies use the Gospel accounts from Year A of the Sunday Lectionary. So, at 10am Mass, we will hear from John's gospel, Jesus' encounter with the Woman at the Well.



Gospel for 6pm Mass: On the Mount of Transfiguration, the disciples caught a glimpse of the fire that burns in the depth of the mystery of Christ. From Moses's first encounter with God in the bush that burned in Horeb, God accompanied his people through the desert in a fiery cloud that eventually filled the Holy of Holies in the Jerusalem Temple. Jesus, in whom the fire still burns, claims to be the new Temple, no longer susceptible to destruction by enemies, even on the Cross, but still and forever present with God's people.

Gospel for 10am Mass: If only we knew the gift of God, and who is saying to us "give me a drink" (John 4:7). John's account of Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman would have us reflect on the reality of our own baptismal life. Do we really know the gift we have been given? Do we know, are we in personal relationship with Jesus who is the giver of life? Today's Gospel calls not only the catechumens who are preparing for Baptism, but all of us who will renew our baptismal vows at the Easter Vigil to drink freely from the water that Jesus gives, for it is the fountain of eternal life.
