Mass (St Aidan's Congregation)

Easter Octave: Two great festivals still retain an octave on the 1969 Revised General Roman Calendar: Christmas and Easter. For eight days we celebrate with great solemnity the joy of the festival; this is why, for example, no other celebration may take the place of these eight days.

Eight is an important number. The early Christians called Sunday the "eighth day." Since our week has seven days, "eighth day" referred to a day beyond the human reckoning of time - beyond time, belonging to the end times. Theologically, this refers to "eschatological" time when Jesus Christ will return in all his glory to gather everything back to God at the end and fullness of time. Thus, the Easter octave means more than simply going from one Sunday to the next; it heightens our expectation that the risen Life we celebrate is the same Life that we will one day share with the Trinity in everlasting glory.

Gospel: The risen Christ greets his fearful disciples with peace, commissions them to carry on his mission, and breathes his forgiving and reconciling Spirit upon them. They are overwhelmed with joy. Thomas who was not present refuses to believe until he is able to see and touch Jesus for himself. A week later, Jesus appears and invites Thomas to see and touch. Thomas, overwhelmed by the risen Christ, makes one of the most profound belief statements ever by addressing Jesus as "my Lord and my God." Jesus proceeds to praise all those like ourselves who have not seen and yet believed. Easter Time allows us the time to deepen our faith and intimate relationship with the risen Christ.

A big 'Thank You' to those who have offered to help with laundering the Altar linens! It seems we now have a small group to form a rota so that the burden does not fall on the same person each week. If you are able to help it's not too late to join the rota!

Thank you too, to all who helped to prepare and minister in the Holy Triduum liturgies: cleaners, Alter servers, readers, Eucharistic ministers, and flower arrangers and musicians. You all helped to enhance our worship during the Paschal season.

If you have a full APF-Mill Hill Red Missio Box please bring it to church next weekend. The contents of the boxes will be counted and sent off to APF-Mill Hill. Copies of the latest Mission Today magazine are available in the porch.

Eight young people from our faith community have been enrolled into our parish preparation for the Sacrament of Holy Communion. This parish community promised to encourage them with our prayers and by the example of our witness to the faith. There will be a preparation session for candidates and their parents with Fr Andy next Saturday, 18th April at 11am in The Guild Room.

Infant Baptism. There will be preparation meeting for parents and godparents, who would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism during the coming spring and summer after 10am Mass on Sunday 26th April 2015.

The Bishops have written a joint Letter to all Catholics in England and Wales encouraging us to participate and vote in the election and offering some key issues and questions for reflection on where candidates stand.
