3RD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

Paschal Candle: Throughout the fifty days of Easter the paschal candle is lit as a reminder of the presence of the risen Christ who lives and is present in and among us, the church. It is as large and prominent in the liturgical space as the resurrection is large and prominent in the life and belief of Christians. During the Easter season the paschal candle is the primary focus in the environment because it speaks so eloquently of Jesus' risen life.

Gospel: Another appearance of the risen Christ to his fearful disciples stresses that Jesus is not a ghost but is really and truly risen. Showering them with peace, he affirms his living presence by asking for something to eat. The disciples, overwhelmed with joy, are instructed by Jesus as he opens "their minds to understand the Scriptures" that were written about him. Having previously instructed them, he now reiterates how the Scriptures predicted that the messiah would have to suffer and die, but rise on the third day. In this manner repentance and forgiveness of sin would be preached to all. They and we are witnesses to these things. This Easter Time, is an opportunity to examine how we are faithful witnesses to the risen Christ.
