The Easter Triduum culminates with the Eater Vigil during which, in symbol, song, and story, we proclaim Jesus risen from the dead. This Easter joy and celebration continues for fifty days as we delve into the richness of the Easter mysteries. Jesus' Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension, and glorification, culminating in the sending of the Spirit at Pentecost. For John's account of the Gospel, the premier narrative of the whole season, as well as for the whole Gospel narrative, these are parts of one interrelated event.

However, these Easter mysteries pack such a power and meaning that, as humans, we need time to digest, dissect, and reflect on their meaning for our lives. That is why the Church tradition and wisdom celebrates Easter Time for fifty days. All fifty days are days of Easter, not days after Easter. The Lectionary readings are meant to help us unpack there rich Easter mysteries.

About Easter Sunday: The celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ continues into Easter Sunday morning. Easter Sunday marks the end of the Triduum and is the first day of the Easter Octave.

Gospel: Mary Magdalene is the first person at the tomb in all four Gospel accounts. In John's account of the Gospel, the anointing of the body has already taken place, but Mary is still the first person on record to go to the tomb. She is the messenger who then brings Peter and the Beloved Disciple to see that the stone has been moved. Cloths lay on the ground, the head cloth arranged in a separate place, all to indicate that this is not the scene of a robbery. Time and future appearances of the Lord will add believers to the community.

A big 'Thank You' to those who have offered to help with laundering the Altar linens! It seems we now have a small group to form a rota so that the burden does not fall on the same person each week. If you are able to help it's not too late to join the rota!
