

ABOUT LITURGY

Communion and greatness: In this Sunday's gospel the disciples are arguing about "who was the greatest" and Jesus teaches them that true discipleship consists in becoming "the least of all." The dynamic is from greatest to least. It is interesting that in the Communion rite exactly the opposite dynamic happens: we go from least to greatest.

At the invitation of the presider to begin the Communion procession ("Behold the Lamb of God . . Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb") we respond with "Lord, I am not worthy . . . " Before coming to the messianic table to participate in the Lord's feast we declare that we are the least among God's people. Then we come to the table and share in the feast and, indeed, become the greatest because we eat the Body and Blood and become what we eat – the Body of Christ. The biblical source for this familiar liturgical text is Matthew 8:8, where the Capernaum centurion approaches Jesus and asks him to heal his servant. When Jesus answers that he will come, the servant replies, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word." At Communion these words are an invitation to Jesus to visit us, now in the most wondrous gift of his Body and Blood. In addition to a confession of humility, these words we utter just before Communion are also an expression of confidence that our Lord will come to us – to nourish us, heal us, strengthen us, save us, and transform us.

The memorial tablet for Sec. Lieut. Arthur George Evelyn Bourchier has been removed for restoration work. During November, the month when the Church traditionally remembers her dead we hope to have a Memorial Mass for both of the soldiers from the Great War commemorated in our church.

Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: The wicked are characterised as believing that life is short, that we were born by chance and we will soon be no more. Therefore, life is always ripe for revelry as we use our strength against the weak. But the response of Wisdom goes on to say that "they are misled, / .../ For God created human beings to be immortal, / . . . / the souls of the upright are in the hands of God" (2:21 – 3:1).

Responsorial Psalm 53: An appeal to the name of God implied an appeal to God's strength and faithfulness: the essence of the divine character. It was a way of asking God to become visibly active in the parishioner's life. The whole of the psalm, like the responsorial itself, proclaims faith that God will care for the unjustly oppressed one.

Second Reading: In today's passage, James returns to the topic of division, this time both within the individual and in the community. The cause is jealousy and selfish ambition. The jealousy James condemned had generated conflicts that he compared to war and murder.

Gospel: The death that Jesus was going toward was politically and physically appalling retort to Peter's rebuke underlined the problem the disciple. Religiously, it was considered proof of the person's God-forsakenness. Jesus, seeing the disciples' opinions about rank, declares that God is to be found where they least expect or want to go. The just one will suffer, but God will not abandon him.
