ABOUT LITURGY

Parish ministry and servanthood: Every Sunday at Mass we see any number of men, women, and children selflessly give of themselves by means of the various liturgical ministries – presiders, deacons, hospitality ministers, music ministers, altar ministers (including servers, sacristans, cleaners, flower arrangers), readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. These are quite visible to all those who come to Sunday Mass. Additionally there are many other parish ministers (e.g. members of the parish council, finance group, school governors, etc.) who, generally, work behind the scenes. Yet when we add all these members together, sad to say the persons actively ministering on a parish remain rather small percentage of the whole parish census. Two points might be worth our reflection time.

First, the parish ministries express real servanthood. Many people sacrifice much of themselves in order to minister in their parishes and this is truly part of what Jesus asks when we are to be servant of all. If we truly believe that the parish is really the people then being serious about our commitment to follow Christ means that our service begins with our own parish community.

Second, we ought to encourage and thank one another for this faithful commitment of service. One time someone mentioned that she had given selflessly for twenty-three years to her parish and on one had ever come up to her and said "thank you." This is a sad commentary on how much we take for granted! Perhaps our greatest expression of servanthood is to recognise and thank those who selflessly model for us what serving all really means.

This being said, we must always remember that the primary locus for our self-emptying is in serving the world, neighbourhood, home. The primary role of the church is to serve the world and be a sign of God's reign in our midst.

The memorial tablet for Sec. Lieut. Arthur George Evelyn Bourchier has been removed for restoration work. During November, the month when the Church traditionally remembers her dead we hope to have a Memorial Mass for both of the soldiers from the Great War commemorated in our church.



Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: Although the opening line of today's selection sounds exceptionally harsh, the point is not that God is pleased with pain; rather, God is pleased with our faithfulness of the servant in spite of and through the course of the servants offering.

Responsorial Psalm 32: The refrain we chant sums up and deepens our appreciation of the prayer as we beg for God's mercy and proclaim and promise our trust.

Second Reading: The author designates Jesus as Son of God, and his emphasis is on divine compassion. The Son of God, far from being aloof, sympathises with each human creature and, as we proclaimed in the psalm, offers mercy and grace whenever we are in need.



Gospel: Not unlike the rich man of last week's gospel, the disciples had not yet understood that the only real security and power come from trust in God. Neither wealth nor power can prevent or survive death.
