

**Annunciation and visitation:** In years A and B the Lectionary selection assigned for the gospel of the Fourth Sunday of Advent is the annunciation account. The gospel acclamation assigned to year C is also from the annunciation account. It is easy to relate to this familiar gospel story to the coming Christmas celebration; after all, physiologically, conception precedes birth. However, the gospel in year C presents us with the story of the visitation. Putting aside the logic of how things happen naturally enables us to see how this story, like the story of the annunciation, leads us to the Christmas mystery. The visitation is another annunciation – Elizabeth "gave a loud cry" and said that her Lord is near, indeed, the fruit of Mary's

**ABOUT LITURGY** 

Every liturgy is both an annunciation and visitation. During each Liturgy of the Word Christ's presence is uniquely announced in the proclamation of the gospel. Even more: in the very proclamation, the person of Jesus comes to dwell within the liturgical assembly. Each Liturgy of the Eucharist is also a kind of visitation when we ourselves take into our very own bodies the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ and are transformed into being more perfect members of the Body. Each liturgy, then, is Christmas. The Word is made flesh and dwells among us!

# **Lectionary for Mass**

First Reading: Bethlehem was a small village overshadowed by the larger and more significant Jerusalem. Yet it is from her that God will bring Israel's greatest blessing, the ideal king who will be Israel's eternal ruler. As the birthplace of King David, Bethlehem always had a claim to fame, but politically and economically it was insignificant. God promised through the prophet that insignificance will turn to glory because the one who will spring from her womb will bring peace to the ends of the earth.

Responsorial Psalm 80: All good comes from God, even the good in our own hearts. Hence the psalmist calls on God to awaken good within us and cause us to turn from our ways to God's ways. From praying for our own conversion, the psalm moves to praying for our own conversion, the psalm move to prayer for the nation and especially for the one whom God has raised up to lead the people. The leadership of God's chosen one will assure that the people will no longer stray from God's righteous path.

Second Reading: Borrowing from Psalm 40, the author of Hebrews reminds us that God values obedience far more than sacrifices. In the Gospel, Jesus often equates love with keeping the commandments. Rituals are important, but only if they reflect the true sacrifice of our lives in obedience to God's will. Christ's exemplary obedience was manifest when he willingly offered his body "once for all."

Gospel: Mary rushes, to the side of Elizabeth who, like her, is the recipient of divine favour. But Elizabeth immediately recognises in Mary one more blessed than she is, and she also understands that what makes Mary special is her ability to trust that God's words to her would be fulfilled. Both women will suffer greatly for the privilege they've been granted – as will their sons – but for now the linked destinies of John and Jesus can't detract from the sheer joy of reaching out to touch a cousin who is also' a recipient of God's surprising grace.
