ABOUT LITURGY

Year C Lenten Gospels: During Year C of the Lectionary three-year cycle, a common thread runs through the gospels from the third to the fifth Sunday of Lent – that of repentance. Not only is this an important Lenten theme, but it is an important theme in Luke's gospel as well.

The penitential act and confession of sins: During Lent we have been using the Confiteor (I confess to almighty God...) for the penitential act at the beginning of Mass. If we consider all the helpful choices we have for the introductory rites and use them well, we can establish a rhythm at the beginning of Mass that captures something of the rhythm of Christian living. Using the Confiteor during Lent (and on Fridays for daily Mass at other times of the year) reminds us that we still must overcome our sinful ways and are always in need of repentance and reconciliation.

Acknowledging God's gifts to us in bringing us to salvation and our sometimes refusal (like Israel of old) of those gifts fosters a genuine humility in us and right relationships with God and others.

Using the Rite for the Blessing and Sprinkling of Water during Easter (and on a few other appropriate Sundays during the year, for example, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord) reminds us that we are the redeemed Body of Christ, plunged into baptismal waters that bring us a share in divine Life. Using the Kyrie invocations as a litany of praise during Ordinary Time reminds us that the Lord Jesus has walked the journey before us and showed us the way through death to new Life. The rhythm, then, flows among repentance and reconciliation, celebration of divine Life, and praise for Jesus' example of dying and rising.

The PASTORAL AREA SERVICE OF RECONCILIATION FOR LENT will take place next Thursday, 3rd March at 7:30pm in St Joseph's Church, Chalfont St Peter (SL9 8RY). Bishop Peter says, "I do hope that you will join me, and that you will bring some family and friends. Together we can be attentive to God's word in our lives. Together we can pray before the Blessed Sacrament. And perhaps it may be an opportunity to rejoice in God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Confession". The Church encourages all Catholics to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. It is an experience of the gift of God's boundless mercy - not only does it free us from our sins but it also challenges us to have the same kind of compassion and forgiveness for those who sin against us.

Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: This familiar yet powerful passage offers us a glimpse of the commission given to Moses by God. God emphasises that he is the God of continuity; this experience is not separated from what has come before, although this is the first moment that the people receive the name of God.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 103: The psalm underlines the reading from Exodus. God is faithful, just, merciful, kind, and always attentive. Those who believe in him need to practice both praise and remembrance. Forgetfulness is a chronic human issue, and the psalm presents a litany of qualities of God that must be remembered.

Second Reading: Here, Paul recounts the wondrous deliverance of the Exodus. Notice the language of Baptism that is used. Paul is inspired to look at these wonders through the lens of Christian Baptism and the Holy Spirit. He also warns that the story bears lessons for those who

would follow Christ.

Gospel: The stories of cruelty and devastation found in this Gospel are exclusive to Luke; they appear in no other Gospel or, for that matter, historical narrative of the time. They are, however, in keeping with what we know of the considerable persecution that the Jews and others experienced under Pilate. These stories, including that of the fig tree, serve to underline the theme of the need for repentance now, not at some time in the future.
