

ABOUT LITURGY

"Lord I am not worthy . . . " At Mass our response in the invitation to Holy Communion includes the words, "Lord, I am not worthy." This Sunday's gospel challenges us to utter these very words not simply as a confession of sinfulness or a way to debase our own dignity as daughters and sons of God, but as a simple statement of recognising our own status as creatures before God's all-powerful and divine boldness. The amazing generosity of Jesus' self-offering of his Body and Blood for our nourishment and drink is that God doesn't focus on our unworthiness but raises us up to share in divinity. Holy Communion should always be a kind of wake-up call in which we praise and thank God for the call to holiness, and also resolve to be faithful to God's call to continue Jesus' mission. Sharing in God's holiness is also sharing in God's mission.

Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: The call of Isaiah follows a familiar pattern. Isaiah has an encounter with the Lord, seeing a vision of the Lord's magnificence in his dwelling in the Temple. Transformed and inspired by that encounter, Isaiah offers himself enthusiastically in service of the Lord. Though Isaiah understands his own limitations, he trusts God and is purified for his mission of preaching God's steadfast love and mercy to a people in great need.

Responsorial Psalm: Today's psalm praises the Lord for rescuing his people. Even though the people have sinned and turned away from God, God's love and mercy never fade. God's saving love inspires a hymn of praise in the people. In the same way, God's actions in our lives are not a private matter, but a public act. Our response must be public as well, praising the Lord in the liturgical assembly of his people.

Second Reading: Like Paul, all disciples are called to share the Gospel. The Gospel we are called to proclaim is quite simple: Jesus died for our sins and was raised from the dead so that we might share in eternal life. If we do not believe in this truth and live our lives formed by this belief, our preaching will be empty and useless. If the preacher is not formed by faith, the preacher will not be able to inspire. convert, and transform.

Gospel: Paralleling the First Reading's call of the prophet Isaiah, the Gospel recounts the call of Jesus' fist disciples. This call follows the familiar pattern. Jesus extends the invitation. Having encountered Jesus and his preaching and having seen his glory (in the miraculous catch of fish), Simon Peter, James, and John are transformed. They abandon the life they have known and begin to follow Jesus, strengthen by the mission with which Jesus entrusts them.
