ABOUT LITURGY

Liturgy of the Word and paschal mystery: Both Isaiah (for example, see Isa 63:1-6) and Luke (for example, the woes recorded in the skipped verse from this Sunday's gospel, vv. 13-16) speak harshly of those who do not hear and accept God's word. The Lectionary selections for this Sunday are for the most part only encouraging words (especially the selection from Isaiah). Although the Liturgy of the Word is always a challenging time, we must be careful not to lose sight of the consolation and encouragement that God's word also brings. This is another play of the dying/rising rhythm of the paschal mystery.

THE LAMPEDUSA CROSS – sending messages of hope

Forced out by war, poverty or persecution, millions of people live uncertain lives as migrants and refugees. But each of us, moved by faith and common humanity, can act in welcome, respect and love. Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: Isaiah speaks of the great joy that will be experienced by all as the Lord restores Jerusalem after the devastation of the Babylonian Exile. Using rich mother metaphors, God will restore Jerusalem from a barren, sorrowful, mournful mother to a fertile, prosperous, loving, and ever-comforting one. The starving, desolated people will once again nurse from her abundant breasts, will exalt over the abundance of water and wealth, and will experience the fondling, comfort, tenderness, and care that a loving mother showers on her nurslings. As a mother comforts, loves, and dotes on her child, so will God do for us. The power of the Lord will be evident to all, with joy and abundant life as its unimaginable manifestation.

Responsorial Psalm 65: The psalmist invites all to "cry out with joy to God," as we experience God's tremendous deeds done on our behalf. The psalm captures the feeling and intent of Isaiah in the first reading, remembering the Exodus as one of God's tremendous deeds "among men." Those wondrous deeds continue today in the life of the psalmist whose prayer God has answered, and who rejoices and praises God while inviting all others to do the same.

Second Reading: Paul asserts that the only thing any disciples can boast in is the Cross of Christ, the most degrading of deaths transformed into the ultimate symbol of God's gracious love to all, no matter the cost. Whether circumcised or uncircumcised, Jew or Gentile, all are new creations in the Lord, who broke down any and all boundaries that as disciples we all bear the marks of Jesus as we willingly give of ourselves in service of others. All this is God's doing trough the grace given to us in Christ.

Gospel: Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples and commissions them to go ahead of him to spread the word concerning God's reign. They are being sent as workers to a rich harvest that God has cultivated. However, they are also warned that such harvesting will involve dangers and challenges, concretised in the image of being sent out "like lambs among wolves." They will experience rejection and opposition. Jesus instructs them as to their behaviour on such a mission, and insists that no matter what they encounter, they are to trust in God who will protect and care for them. They return rejoicing at the great work that they were able to accomplish in God's name, as Jesus proclaims that with God's reign, Satan is defeated and his disciples have their names recorded in heaven.
