About Liturgy

Veneration of the altar and the presence/coming of the Messiah:
When the entrance procession reaches the sanctuary space and the

When the entrance procession reaches the sanctuary space and the ministers have made their reverence of the altar, the presider (and deacon) approach the altar and kiss it. We are occupied with singing the entrance song, so we probably don't pay too much attention to this profound gesture. Yet it is fraught with meaning.

This gesture dates at least to the fourth century and probably has its origin in ancient culture: often families would kiss the table before a meal began as a kind of greeting. Thus, one interpretation of the veneration of the altar by a kiss is that the presider is greeting Christ who is present among the faithful.

At its dedication the altar was anointed with holy chrism and thus became a symbol of Christ's Presence in the assembly. We begin liturgy, then, with a gesture that reminds us of Christ, and we are at the same time reminded that we are the Body of Christ, now gathered around the Head who us present. Christ's Presence is a poignant reminder of who we are – members of his Body. It is also a reminder of how we are to live – doing his works. Our works are to "kiss" others with Christ's Presence and goodness.

We are now in the season of **ADVENT**. For our children (and the young at heart), there are *Advent & Christmas Calendars* for 50 pence. **Mission TODAY** 2017 Calendars are available in the porch for Missio Members.

Advent Service of Reconciliation Tuesday, 13th December at 8pm at St Joseph's Church, Austin Green, Chalfont St. Pete, SL9 8RY. God never, ever tires of forgiving us. The problem is that we ourselves tire; we do not want to ask; we grow weary of asking for forgiveness. The Sacrament of Reconciliation, or Confession as it's better known, offers us an important way of getting closer to God - to be forgiven for our sins. As Pope Francis puts it "it's an encounter with the Lord's mercy which spurs us on to do our best". Come and join us for a special Advent Service of Reconciliation (with visiting priests) in St Joseph's Church and experience the simple generosity of God's love.

Lectionary for Mass

About Gaudete Sunday The Third Sunday of Advent (like the Fourth Sunday of Lent) is a day of joy in the midst of a penitential season. It is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin of the Entrance Antiphon for today: Gaudete in Domino semper, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near" (Philippians 4:4-5). The antiphon captures the mood of the entire liturgy as we move into the second part of Advent: there is a sense of joyful expectation, an awareness that the fulfilment of God's great plan for us is near. That sense is strong in today's readings.

First Reading: There is much joy and anticipation as we await rare desert flowers and miraculous cures. God restores all that has become barren to former beauty, and those who have been taken captive in Babylon will be freed and will enter Zion (Jerusalem) singing. What encouragement for the feeble and the frightened, to hear they will be made whole again!

Responsorial Psalm 145 is a song of praise, giving thanks to God for all that he has done. The response is fashioned from Isaiah 35:4, reiterating the notion that our God will come and save us. The tense of the psalm reminds us that this is not a concept from of old, but a reality for today. Psalm 145 is the joyful prayer of one who has lived through terrible times only to shine from praising God's name. Faith and trust are learned amidst pain and suffering.

Second Reading: Patience is a difficult virtue to learn and act upon. None of us wants to hear "in God's time." We want what we want now. Yet, in his wisdom, James counsels that we must wait patiently and joyously, and to never, give up. Temptation and rash judgments are things which can get us into trouble when we do not think things through and spontaneously act upon our desires. We must be patient. Let the seed grow.

The Gospel: It is ironic that as we speak of waiting, John the Baptist becomes impatient, wondering "are you [Jesus] the one who is to come or have we got to wait for someone else?" He seems disappointed that there is not a big, fiery finish. Jesus rebukes him and, paraphrasing Isaiah, says that the prophecies have now been fulfilled. However, realising he responded quickly, Jesus goes on to tell the crowds great things that John has done.
