About Liturgy

Liturgy and the identity of Christ: Each liturgy includes numerous times when we acknowledge the identity and Presence of Christ. For example, we begin Mass each time with the sign of the cross – an acknowledgement not simply of the Presence of "Christ, the Son of the living God," but of the other two persons of the Trinity as well. Even more telling is our language preceding and concluding the proclamation of the gospel. In both acclamations we utter praise: "Glory to you, O Lord"; "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." It is telling that we use second person pronouns in these two acclamations: you (we don't do so at the conclusion of the first and second readings). Our language itself is saluting the very person of Christ whom we address as really present to us in this assembly, during this gospel proclamation, during the Mass.

The gospel acclamations say something more: by our *common* acknowledgement of the Presence of Christ in the very proclamation of the gospel. We also are binding ourselves together as one community; the "glue" that binds us is none other than our shared identity as the Body of Christ which we ourselves proclaim by acknowledging Christ's Presence. The proclamation of the gospel is a particular moment for building up the Body of Christ, the church!

Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: The First Reading describes the transferal of authority as Shebna is removed from his high post, master of the palace, and a new leader, Eliakim, put in his place and invested with all his power. God is the giver of authority.

Responsorial Psalm: In Psalm 137, we ask God to be involved in our lives, to stay with his creation and continue to bless "the work of your hands."

Second Reading: This wonderful meditation on the mystery of God concludes the sequence of readings we have heard about the Jewish people. God's ways are beyond our understanding. We can only wonder and trust in the wisdom of God.

Gospel: In the First Reading, God chose Eliakim as a leader for his people. Here, Jesus chooses Peter. Peter is chosen not because of his leadership potential – Just two Sundays ago, who boldly stepped out into the lake, but whose confidence quickly faded at the sight of the waves. Rather, Peter is chosen because he has learned to listen to the voice of God – for it is through God that Peter is able to recognise Jesus as the Christ. Peter is called the "rock," but the strength of the Church built upon him does not come from Peter, but rather from God.



September – Month of Our Lady of Sorrows

On 15th September, the Church observes a memorial honouring Mary as Our Lady of Sorrows. "And a sword will pierce your own soul, too." Simeon told Mary when she presented the child Jesus in the Temple forty days after his birth (Luke 2:35). That prophecy was fulfilled when Mary stood at the foot of her Son's Cross, sharing his bitter suffering. During this month of September, we honour Mary under the title of Our Lady of Sorrows. This month, let us bring to Mary all our sorrows, knowing that she understands what it is to suffer. This month is a good time to draw closer to Mary by meditating on the great hymn to the Mother of Sorrows, Stabat mater, or "At the Cross of her Station Keeping," In this beautiful prayer, we ask for the grace to feel with Mary, to share her sorrows.
