About Liturgy

Liturgical Ministries as responding to God's call for labourers: Many of us take for granted those who minister at Mass each Sunday - assembly, presider, deacon, hospitality ministers (or greeters), altar ministers, music ministers, readers, extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Sometimes, too, because we minister when our name appears on the schedule, we might fall into the trap of thinking we are just getting necessary jobs accomplished, General Instruction of the Roman Missal 91 speaks of the Eucharistic celebrations as an action of the whole church in which different orders and offices unfold and the ordained ministers and lay Christian faithful fulfil "their function or their duty" according to what "pertains to them."

Whatever ministries are exercised by different persons during the liturgy, they are always undertaken after careful discernment of one's abilities, prayer to do God's will (hear God's call to minister), and appropriate preparation for the ministers also witness to God's persistent call to followers of Jesus to be labourers in the divine vineyard who make present the kingdom continue Jesus' work here on

Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: Whose way is not fair, God's or ours? This is the question at the heart of the prophetic words from Ezekiel. Turn from wickedness to do what is right and just. the prophet instructs. God's way is fair, because God will save the life of a person who acts in this manner. Following the commandments leads to life, not death. Not following the commandments, which sometimes is our way and was the way of the Israelites, leads to death. Rephrase, the positive question of this reading is, Whose way is fair?

Responsorial Psalm 24: The author of the psalm prays that the Lord make his ways known. Together with the psalmist we pray to God for guidance in following God's ways of truth and justice. When we sin and fail to follow, we ask in the words of the psalm refrain for the Lord to remember his

Second Reading: Our attitude must match the attitude that is in Christ Jesus. Our mind is to be of the same mind as Christ Jesus. This is the essence of Paul's words to the Philippians. In Christ, humility, not selfishness, is our motivation. Christ's humility led to his exaltation. So, too, ours will lead us to life in God's glory.

Gospel: In Matthew, the parable of the two sons whom the father asks to work in his vineyard follows immediately after the authorities question Jesus about from where his authority for teaching in the temple comes. In this parable, one son tells his father he will not work, and then does. The other son says he will work, and then does not. Beginning with an "Amen," Jesus solemnly teaches that the first son, like tax collectors and prostitutes, and all those who change their mind, repent, and follow him with share in the Kingdom
