About Liturgy

Fruit of the vine: The image of the vineyard and tenants and fruit might lead us to think that the fruit we are to produce as faithful disciples is something that only occurs in the future. In fact, God has already given us the fruit of the vine and with this the strength we need to produce even more abundant fruit. This image of "fruit of the vine" can have many meanings, one of them being the good works we perform for others in our daily living. More specifically with respect to Mass, we are offered the "fruit of the vine" as Jesus; Precious Blood at Holy Communion.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal 281, states that Communion under both kinds "has a fuller form as a sign. It further states that the reason for this is that the new covenant was ratified in Jesus' Blood and in this the relationship between our Eucharistic banquet and the messianic banquet can more clearly be seen. Everyone should be encouraged to participate in this fuller sign of God's love for us.

THE ROSARY CRUSADE OF REPARATION Saturday 14th October 2017

The crusade will once again take to the streets of London in honour of Our Lady in the month of the Holy Rosary. Celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Apparitions of Our Lady at Fatima. Led by Bishop John Keenan, Bishop of Paisley.

The procession follows a route from Westminster Cathedral to the Brompton Oratory which is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. At Fatima, Our Lady promised that her Immaculate Heart would triumph, but we must do our duty through prayer and sacrifice.

The Crusade will assemble at 1:45pm at Westminster Cathedral and will be finished by about 5.00pm. On arrival at the Oratory church, there will be rosary, hymns to Our Lady, a sermon, Solemn Benediction and the opportunity for enrolment in the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Lectionary for Mass

First Reading: The song of the vineyard is today's First Reading. The friend who has a vineyard is the Lord and the Lord's vineyard is Israel. The Lord had done much for Israel, yet her people at times chose to distance themselves from God. Their fruit was wild grapes, not the crop of grapes the friend desired. Now the house of Israel faces the Lord's judgement.

Responsorial Psalm 79: The refrain from the Psalm is taken from the beginning of the final verse of the first Reading. Israel is the Lord's vineyard. The verses come from Psalm 79, a communal lament of Israel's people in which they wonder why the Lord has seemingly deserted them after transplanting them out of Egypt. We hear the voice of the people plead for the Lord to once again take care of them. For their part, they will return to God and remain faithful.

Second Reading: Paul encourages the Philippians to make their requests known to God in prayer. Since they are able to petition God, the Philippians need to have no anxiety. God's peace in Christ Jesus will safeguard them. In addition, Paul lists the virtues to which Christ Jesus calls the Philippians: good, pure, love, honour

, purity, love, and graciousness. Whatever is praiseworthy is their calling. To live in this manner is to know the peace of God residing within us.

Gospel: The Sunday's Gospel reading is another parable and a continuous reading from where the parable of last Sunday's Gospel left off. The landowner and the vineyard in the parable provide obvious parallels with the first Reading; the Servants the landowner sends represent the prophet's whose message the people often did not heed. The son whom the tenants kill foreshadows Jesus' Death at the hands of the authorities. Jesus' citation of Psalm 118 reveals that his Death is not the end. Through his Resurrection he lays the cornerstone for the Kingdom of God, a kingdom for those disciples willing to produce its fruit.
