Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

In *Christifidelis laici*, Pope John Paul II writes that, in her work in the world, the Church is confronted by contradictions of human nature, sin, and the Evil One. Still, the apostolic exhortation states, the Church lives in hope, for as today's Gospel states, God sent Jesus to us. *Christifidelis laici*, 7, states, "Despite all this, then, humanity is able to hope. Indeed it must hope: the living and personal Gospel, Jesus Christ himself, is the "good news" and the bearer of joy that the Church announces each day, and to whom the Church bears testimony before all people."

In both the First Reading and the Gospel, we see what God has done for us. The reading from the Second Book of Samuel details how God took David from the pasture, made him a leader, was with him wherever he went, and how David's house will endure forever. We see how God continues to be with us as the angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will bear the Son of the Most High. God's love came first and enables us to love. In the encyclical *Dues caritas est* (DCE), Pope Benedict XVI explains that God continues to make his love known to us in the liturgy, and from that love we spread God's love to others. DCE, 17, states: "In the church's liturgy, in her prayer, in the living community of believers, we experience the love of God, we perceive his presence and thus we experience the love of God, we perceive his presence and thus learn to recognise that presence in our daily lives. He has loved us first and he continues to do so; we too, then, can respond with love. God does not demand of us a feeling which we ourselves we incapable of producing . . . since he has 'loved us first,' love can also blossom as a response within us."

We are now well into the season of ADVENT. To help nourish us journey this four-week journey until 31st December, both *Walk with Me* and *My Day by Day* Advent 2017 prayer booklets are available at a price of £1.00 each.

'A BIBLICAL WALK THROUGH THE MASS'

A five week course for Lent 2018. Lectionary for Mass

Not until 2023 will Christmas Eve again fall on the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The proximity of these two solemnities highlights the theme of today's readings – the revelation of God's mystery. The biblical word mystery is not about a puzzle to be solved or something impossible to understand. Rather it concerns a magnificent thing that will now be revealed in the last days to those who have faith.

In the First Reading, David desires to build a house for God, but through the prophet Nathan, God tells David that he never asked for a house and plans always to dwell among the people as he did during their desert wanderings. At the time, God promises to build a house (or a dynasty) for David and to give him a son who will be an everlasting king and whom God will treat like his own son. What astonishing favour David receives from God!

The Gospel builds upon the imagery of this David story. The angel Gabriel tells Mary that she is God's favoured one and that she will give birth to a son who "will be called Son of the Most High" and who will be given "the throne of his ancestor David" (Luke 1:32). How utterly confused this young girl must have been! Yet she quickly gives her fiat (Latin for "let it happen") to the angel's words.

In the Second Reading, we are invited to join in a doxology, a prayer of praise to God that celebrates God's hidden plan for humanity. This plan is gradually revealed through the prophets and the covenants and is fully manifest in the person of Jesus. That manifestation is what we celebrate at Christmas.
