### **Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition**

We hear in today's reading from Philippians of how St Paul sought to be conformed to Christ's death so that he might share in the resurrection form the dead. Since this was Paul's focus, the "loss of all things" was unimportant to him. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that those who die in Christ will live in Christ. "For those who die in Christ's grace it is a participation in the death of the Lord so that they may also share in his Resurrection" (1006).

In today's Gospel, Jesus comes to the aid of the woman caught in adultery. We may not encounter a person about to be stoned; however, mercy can be shown in so many other ways. We can mirror God's boundless mercy through the Spiritual and Corporal Works of mercy. The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the works of mercy as "charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbour in his spiritual and bodily necessities" (2447).

## **Lectionary for Mass**

It's hard to imagine how the Pharisees portrayed in today's

Gospel (John 8:1-11) caught the woman "committing adultery." Nonetheless, they have brought her before Jesus, "as a test, looking for something to use against him." The Law of Moses demands that such a woman be stoned to death. What does Jesus have to say about it? The First Reading (Isaiah 43:16-21) gives us a hint of the direction Jesus will take. "No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See I am doing a new deed." The Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14) offers this input: "forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead." These two readings set us up for the story of the woman taken in adultery. What do you say? How will you judge this woman? Mercy and life or legality and death? Jesus knows that the guery was intended to put him in a difficult place. If he sides with the legalists, he may gain their respect but lose that of his disciples, who see him as merciful. If he suggests that forgiveness should be extended, the scribes and Pharisees can claim that Jesus disregards matters of the law. Jesus cleverly sidesteps the question and offers a challenge to his questioners, forcing them to choose. Once those who recognised their sinfulness walked away. Jesus could clearly state his position on this matter without incurring the wrath of his questioners. "Neither do I condemn you...go away, and don't sin anymore." Once again, mercy trumps judgement until we recognise the sin within ourselves. Only then can we offer what we desire for ourselves: forgiveness, compassion, and understanding. 'The Golden Rule is applicable here. When confronted with such a situation, we must treat others as we want to be treated because this is what Jesus would do. As Pope Francis has repeatedly reminded, God never tires of forgiving us. Dare we do any less? Notice that Jesus doesn't do anything to enforce admonition to the "don't sin anymore." He trusts the woman to make her choices, praying that she'll walk in virtue. Jesus respects the individual conscience, so he sent her away with few words. Liturgy and Life
