Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

The refrain of today's Responsorial Psalm proclaims, "The just will live in the presence of the Lord." The bishops' 1985 pastoral letter of the economy considers justice and the dignity of people as it examines the economic system. In *Economic Justice for All*, the bishops state: "Human dignity comes from God . . . We judge any economic system by what it does for and to people and by how it permits al to participate in it" (15).

When Abraham saw three strangers, he immediately acted out of hospitality, washing their feet and bringing food. This love of neighbour shows love for God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church stats: "By charity, we love God above all things and our neighbour as ourselves for love of God" (1844).

The story of Mary and Martha in today's Gospel is a wonderful description of family dynamics! Perhaps we could use this Sunday to have a good discussion as a family about the importance of everyone's responsibility for the happiness of family life? Maybe it's a good time to review the various family chores. The conversation needs to be respectful and honest, no judgemental remarks or hurtful innuendoes. The family of faith, both in church and in the home is a sign of Christ's presence in the world. Praying together as a family, as Mary contemplated the teaching of Jesus, and working together as a family, like Martha who desired to serve others, can be complementary ways that enrich the spiritual life of young and old alike. Would you consider yourself a Mary or a Martha, or a combination of both?

Lectionary for Mass

Throughout the ancient world, hospitality was the most significant virtue practiced by every culture. In welcoming a quest, people believed that they may unknowingly be welcoming a divinity in disguise, as occurs in the First Reading (Genesis 18:1-10a) today. From his tent, Abraham sees three men passing in the distance. He runs to offer hospitality. Unknowingly, they are angels (messengers) sent by God. They bless Abraham and Sarah with the news that Sarah will bear a son. "Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels" (Hebrews 13:2).

Hospitality is also at the heart of today's Gospel (Luke 10:38-42) as Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary. Jesus uses this visit to teach something deeper about hospitality. While Mary sits at Jesus' feet, Martha complains to Jesus because Mary is not doing anything to help her. Instead of agreeing with Martha, Jesus chides her in a kindly way: "Martha, Martha, you worry and fret so many things." He goes on to say that Mary "has chosen the better part." While not rejecting Martha's cooking, Jesus wants to remind Martha, and through her us, that service must also be connected to listening. Service that does not embrace listening to Jesus' word misses the heart of everything. That is why Jesus says that Mary has chosen the better part of the meal. Christianity requires serve, but the Word of the Lord needs to be heard
