# **Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition**

Pope John Paul II's encyclical *Sollicitudo rei socialis* points to the story of the rich man and Lazarus, noting the options for the poor that Christian tradition bears witness. The pope states, "Love of preference for the poor, and the decisions which it inspires in us, cannot but embrace the immense multitudes of the hungry, the needy . . . It is impossible not to take account of the existence of these realities. To ignore them would mean becoming like the 'rich man' who pretended not to know the beggar Lazarus lying at his gate" (42).

In the Gospel, the rich man knew the Commandments and the teachings of the prophets but had a hardened heart regarding the starving man at his door. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains that the Christian needs constantly be attentive to the formation of conscience. "The education of conscience is a lifelong task. . . Prudent education teaches virtue, it prevents or cures fear, selfishness and pride. . and feelings of complacency, born of human weakness and faults" (1784).

'UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE' WITH FR MATT BLAKE: Fr Matt will be presenting three sessions at St Joseph's Church, helping us to understand the history and context of the Bible. The evening sessions are 2, 9 and 16 October starting at 7.45pm, or the morning sessions are 3, 10 and 17 October from 9.30am. This short course will be in preparation for the coming year of "The God Who Speaks" (see below). Flyers available in the porch.

'THE GOD WHO SPEAKS' - THE YEAR OF THE WORD 2020: The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have designated next year as the Year of the Word 2020, with a focus on the Bible and 'The God Who Speaks'. During the year, we will be invited to celebrate, live and share God's word in a more focussed way.

We are looking for two volunteers to be **faith-sharers** to the young people (aged 13-14 years) who will be preparing for the **Sacrament of Confirmation** in 2020. The preparation course is likely to run from Advent 2019 through to May 2020. You are not required to attend every session. No experience is needed, only a wish to pass on the faith to a new generation. Training is available as well as mentoring. This is an exciting opportunity and participation in the course as a catechists would be very rewarding.

No one should be beyond reach of the love and support they need to thrive. # **Lectionary for Mass**

"Woe to the complacent," shouts the prophet Amos in the First Reading (Amos 6:1a, 4-7). Indifference to the needs and plight of those around us challenge the prophet Amos and Jesus in today's readings.

In three scenes, Luke tells the parable in the Gospel (16:19-31). In the first, a contrast is drawn between the sumptuous lifestyle of the rich man (who remains unnamed) and the poor man (named Lazarus) covered with sores and lying at the entrance to the rich man's estate. There Lazarus dies, forgotten, with no mention of burial. The rich man also dies and is buried.

The next scene takes place in the afterlife, where the roles are reversed and Lazarus is with Abraham while the rich man is in torment. In the final scene, the rich man begs that his brothers be warned about their fate for overlooking the poor. Like the rich man and his brothers, we have the teachings of Scripture, but we also have the example from this parable and more importantly that of Christ, to remind us of our responsibility to care for the needs of others.

Christians can never be indifferent to the needs of and injustices done to others. Pope Paul VI said in *Populorum progression*, 23, "it is well known how strong were the words used by the Fathers of the Church to describe the proper attitude of persons who possess anything towards persons in need. To quote Saint Ambrose: 'You are not making a gift of your possessions to the poor person. You are handling over to him what is his. For what has been given in common for the use of all, you have abrogated to yourself"
