Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

In the Gospel, we see how Jesus brings the woman to faith. By the time the conversation between Christ and the Samaritan woman ends, she is ready to bring the news of the Messiah to the townspeople. The Preface of the Eucharistic Prayer today speaks of how Christ creates the gift of faith in those who seek him. With the priest, we pray in the Preface, "For when he asked the Samaritan woman for water to drink, / he had already created the gift of faith within her" (*The Roman Missal*, Preface for the Third Sunday of Lent).

Jesus, tells the Samaritan woman that he can give her "living water." On the Third Sunday of Lent, in the exorcism during the first scrutiny, the priest prays over the elect" "Lord Jesus, you are the fountain for which they thirst; ... / Show your elect the way of salvation in the Holy Spirit" (*Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*, 154).

The Samaritan woman is changed through the encounter with Jesus. She had been a woman who lived in sin but now is proclaiming the Gospel with enthusiasm. St. Augustine explains in a treatise that the woman portrays the Church. "The woman of Samaria is a symbol of the Church not yet made righteous but about to be made righteous" (*Liturgy of the Hours*, II: 212, from a treatise on John by St. Augustine, bishop).

Coronavirus (Covid-19) Update: Several measures have been put in place here in Our Lady's Church to help keep us all safe. Holy water stoups and baptismal font have been removed, passing of the collection basket is by collector only and the physical sign of peace has been suspended. For Communion at the Sunday 10am and weekday Masses only the Host will be given, and only on the hand. There will be no refreshments after the 10am Mass. These measures are effective until further notice and aim to reduce the physical contact between individuals. If you have cold or flu symptoms, or a temperature, please refrain from attending Mass until you are well again. The situation will remain under review.

The National Novena to St Joseph will take place from 10th - 18th March 2020 at St Joseph's Church in Maidenhead. Each year the Mill Hill Missionaries prepare for the Feast of St Joseph, their patron, with a special Novena of Masses and prayers to ask for God's blessing on their Society and the missionary outreach of the Church, as well as for the intentions of all those who support their work. You are invited to send in your petitions and/or to request a Novena booklet to enable you to join in from home by praying the daily Novena prayer.

Scripture Insights

Today's readings pose two questions that bring our Lenten journey into focus: "Is the Lord with us or not?" and "What are you looking for?"

The First Reading comes from Exodus 17, the early stages of Israel's forty-year journey in the desert. The Israelites had begun quarrelling among themselves and grumbling against Moses, complaining about a lack of food and water. They even tested God, asking whether he was even in their midst. Moses pleads to God for intervention, and God responds by empowering Moses to draw water from the rock for the people to drink. Even though the Lord was indeed in the midst of the community during the desert journey, the Israelites' fears, intensified by their grumbling and complaining, blinded them to the Lord's presence.

In today's Gospel reading from John, Jesus meets a Samaritan women at a well. With the simple request for her to give him a drink, Jesus initiates a dialogue that intrigues and transforms her. Just as she has come to believe in Jesus, the disciples return from their errand to a nearby town. John tells us in an aside that on seeing the woman, they fail to ask her what she is looking for – the very question Jesus had asked the first disciples, the question that initiated their conversion (see John 1:38). In the Gospel according to John, true discipleship involves first and foremost bringing others to Christ. The distracted disciples fail to evangelise – in contrast to the Samaritan woman, who, once she believes that Jesus is the Christ, hurries to her town to bring others to him.

As we continue through our Lenten journey, we are challenged to overcome fears and distractions, to find the Lord in our midst, and to bring others to him.

Liturgy and Life

(1) How can you cease grumbling this Lent and trust that the Lord is present in your life? (2) Do you nurture the hope that God has given you? (3) At what point in the Gospel, can you identify with the Samaritan woman? How can you continue that encounter with Christ?
