Infant Baptism and Marriage are currently being postponed until our response to the Coronavirus Pandemic ends and things return to normal. The Church requires notice of at least six months prior to the Sacrament of Matrimony being celebrated.

Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

In the reading from Acts, Peter not only tells of Jesus' good works, and of his dying and rising, but attests to his being the Messiah the prophets had predicted. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Christ's Resurrection is the fulfilment of the promises both of the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life" (652).

Each of the readings today points to one event – the Resurrection. Acts records that Peter, a first witness to Christ's rising from the dead, preached that the person he ate and drank with was the one to whom "the prophets bear witness." In Colossians, Paul tells his followers how they are to act if they had been "raised with Christ." With the Resurrection, we have been reconciled with God. For this reason, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts,' the 'Solemnity if solemnities" (1169).

The Catechism teaches, that Christ is alive in a new way after the Resurrection. "In his risen body he passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space. At Jesus' resurrection his body is filled with the power of the Holy Spirit: he shares the divine life in his glorious state, so that St. Paul can say that Christ is 'the man of heaven" (645-647). One way Jesus is alive to us is in the Eucharist. Quoting St. Irenaeus, the Catechism states, "Just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection" (1000).

Scripture Insights

Easter Sunday celebrate the core of Christian faith: belief in Jesus' Resurrection from the dead. All four Gospel accounts begin their Resurrection narratives with the experience of the empty tomb. In John, we hear the reactions of Mary of Magdala, Simon peter, and the Beloved Disciple, Mary of Magdala reports immediately to the other two that "they have taken the Lord from the tomb." Clearly she does not yet believe that Jesus had risen. Simon Peter reacts by investigating the tomb itself. But all he discovers is the "burial cloths" and "the cloth that had covered his head." The Beloved Disciples also enters the tomb and likewise sees the burial cloths. But John tells that "he saw and believed." John also tells us that "they [Mary of Magdala, Simon Peter, and the Beloved Disciple] did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." While none of the three followers yet understands, the Beloved Disciple alone believes without understanding.

In the First Reading from Acts, we hear part of a speech that Perter delivers in the household of Cornelius, a God-fearing Gentile centurion who comes to believe in Jesus, though he does not yet have understanding. Peter recounts the public ministry of Jesus, from the activities of John the Baptist to the resurrected Christ's apostolic commission to preach to all people. Peter had eventually come to believe and understand that "everyone [Jew and Gentile alike] who believes in him [Jesus] will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

We learn in these readings that the Resurrection of Christ often surpasses human understanding. Even more important than understanding the Resurrection is believing
