### **Scripture Insights**

What is heaven like? Wouldn't we all like to know! So, it's not surprising that people asked Jesus this question. But instead of telling them about harps, clouds, and pearly gates, he told them about seeds. It's true that the Kingdom of Heaven is the hope of eternal life, but according to Jesus, the Kingdom of Heaven is not only something in our future. It's here already, planted like a seed in the hearts of those who believe, and in the Church. It may be hidden, like the seed under the dirt or the yeast folded into the dough, but it is here, nevertheless. And Jesus promised that what is now concealed will someday be revealed (Matthew 10:26).

The time we live in is a time of waiting between the planting and the harvest – that is, between Jesus' first coming and his return. But during that time, those who follow Jesus are expected to do some things. We can continue the work of Jesus by spreading the seeds of the Kingdom. When we love our neighbour, when we feed the hungry, when we talk about our faith with others, we are planting seeds.

But there is one thing we are not to do, and that is to judge others. That means we are not allowed to try to determine who are the "wheat" and who are the "weeds." As our First Reading says, we are to treat others with leniency and kindness. The psalm reminds us to forgive. In fact, forgiving others is another way to plant the seeds of the Kingdom (Matthew 18:21-25). Judgement is God's job, and even he is not yet doing it because there is still time for conversion – as long as one is alive, there is still time to return to God. So keep spreading those seeds.

# Liturgy and Life

What is your reaction to the phrase "Those who are just must be kind" in the reading from Wisdom? (2) When have you looked to the Spirit relearn how to pray? (3) How do you seek to nurture your faith?

### **Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition**

In the Responsorial Psalm, we hear that God is forgiving and abounding in kindness and fidelity. His power is shown by the mercy he showers on sinners. The Catechism explains "God is the Father Almighty, whose fatherhood and power shed light on one another: God reveals his fatherly omnipotence by the way he takes care of our needs; by the filial adoption that he gives us . . . finally by his infinite mercy, for he displays his power at its height by freely forgiving sins" (270).

If followers of Jesus are to reflect God in the world, they are to be merciful and forgiving to others, just as God is described in the reading from Wisdom. The Catechism states, "The Christian . . . should strive to works of mercy and charity, as well as by prayer and the various practices of penance, to put off completely the 'old man' and to put on the 'new man'" (1473).

# REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS

Our Lady's Church is now open for Mass and public worship. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. Bishop David is advocating a 'soft re-installation' programme to begin with, and it could be some time before we return to normal. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance to our Bishop, and he does not wish for anyone to be placed in vulnerable position of any kind. As a general point any public act of worship that can be deferred until the autumn should be. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. If you are coming by car, and it is a school day, please do not park in Our Lady's School, instead park responsibly in nearby roads, to allow for those with limited mobility to park in the limited space around the church building. I am so grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please follow the guidance of our stewards.
