In todav's Gospel, Jesus uses a parable - a story - to teach his followers that we must always be prepared! When Jesus walked the earth, there was no electricity. The only light a person used at night was a lamp filled with oil. In this story, some of the young women (who are like bridesmaids) prepared themselves for darkness as they made sure they had enough oil to last throughout the night. While other young women were not prepared and had to go find more oil! This caused many of them to miss the arrival of the bridegroom, and be locked out of the wedding feast!

Jesus is telling his followers that we must always be prepared for His return, and for heaven! He is using this story to say that He is the bridegroom, and we are all the bridesmaids - that we don't know when He will return, but when He does we need to be ready!
