Scripture Insights

For the third consecutive week, our first reading is from the Book of Isaiah. In today's selection we hear the words of one who is called by God to be an instrument of God's nurturing love to those most in need – the poor, the broken-hearted, and those imprisoned and held captive.

Our responsorial psalm today is one of the most well-known poems of the New Testament, Mary's Magnificat. The words are reminiscent of the song Hannah sings (1 Samuel 2:1-10) as she rejoices after having borne a son and offered him back to the Lord.

In Paul's first letter to the Thessalonian community, we hear a series of rapid commands: Be happy. Pray. Never try to suppress the Spirit or treat the gift of prophecy with contempt; think before you do anything. Pail then offers a brief but beautiful prayer that reminds us that God is always faithful.

Today's Gospel from John harkens back to last week's Gospel from Mark, where we were introduced to John the Baptist. Once again, we find ourselves at the beginning of a Gospel. Unlike Mark's straight forward telling of the Baptist's ministry, this Gospel presents the Baptist somewhat more mysteriously. He is one who came "as a witness to speak for the light." When questioned by the authorities about his identity, his responses are "I am not" and "no." Finally, John the Baptist identifies himself as the one who is preparing the way for one far greater than he. That one, although not named in this reading, is Jesus the Christ.

Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

Time is counted during Advent through the candles on the Advent Wreath, candles that tell of the light that Christ brings to the world. The rose candle for the Third Sunday of Advent announces the joyfulness of this time. "The candles [of the wreath] represent the four weeks of Advent, and the number of candles lighted each week corresponds to the number of the current week of Advent, also known as Gaudete Sunday" (Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers, 73).

In the responsorial psalm, we sing Mary's words of praise for god. The spirit of these words should animate our faith lived out in our works as we advocate for the marginalised. The Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church states: "Looking to the heart of Mary, to the depth of her faith expressed in the words of the Magnificat, Christ's disciples are called to renew ever more fully in themselves 'the awareness that the truth about God who saves, the truth about God who is the source of every gift, cannot be separated from the manifestation of his love of preference for the poor and humble, that love which, celebrated in the Magnificat, is later expressed in the words and works of Jesus" (59).

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS

Our Lady's Church has now reopened for Public Worship, Private Prayer and Funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. It could be some time before we return to normal. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance to our Bishop, and he does not wish for anyone to be placed in vulnerable position of any kind. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament:

Mondays: 2pm – 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

As the colder autumn weather has now arrived, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 1130am.

During Advent the Hill Mill Missionaries will help us to pause and reflect in preparation for Christmas. Each Friday you are invited to join us online to reflect on the Gospel for the upcoming Sunday. Our time of prayer will be at 10.30am each

Friday and will last for about 20 minutes. Join us on: 18 December - Fr Vincent Oates MHM Christmas Day - Fr Anthony Chantry MHM (this will be pre-recorded and available to view from Christmas Eve) Please do not worry if you cannot make every session, you are welcome to come along whenever you can. If you are able to join us, we would love for you to stay around after the time of prayer to meet with us and other Local Secretaries to share ideas and ask any questions that you have.
