Scripture Insights

"The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision." The Bible explains the mechanics of God's communication with the patriarchs, matriarchs, prophets, and the apostles. But God's Word was a vivid reality to its hearers, and it caused them to act decisively, even if to outsiders that obedience appeared strange or even insane.

Abraham and Sarah set out to receive an unseen inheritance, sure of nothing except the word that had burned itself into their souls. They went out, not knowing where they were going, the Lord prompting them in vague but unmistakable ways. Most translations of Hebrews 11:11 say that Abraham received the power to father Isaac by faith. Some manuscripts, followed by the New Jerusalem Bible, say that it was Sarah who received this word: "it was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise was faithful to it." Whether or not this is the original reading, her pregnancy shows that Sarah shared Abraham's habit of trusting the Word of the Lord.

Venerable Simeon and Anna represent Old Testament piety at its best, very much like Abraham and Sarah. Their hidden source of life was their expectant trust in the Word given by the Lord. Simeon was "awaiting the consolation of Israel" (2:25); Anna was counted among those "awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem" (2:38). From long experience they knew and lived the Word and its prophetic fulfilment as if it already existed. Because they loved and lived it, they sensed its near approach and instantly recognised the reality when it arrived.

Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

In the gospel, Simeon calls Jesus "alight for revelation to the Gentiles / and glory for your people Israel." The first words of *Lumen gentium*, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, reflect Simeon's prayer. The Second Vatican Council document proclaims that the Church is to spread Christ's light. *Lumen gentium* states, "Christ is the Light of nations. Because he is so, this Sacred Synod gathered together in the Holy Spirit eagerly desires, by proclaiming the Gospel to every creature, to bring the light of Christ to all men, a light brightly visible on the countenance of the Church" (1).

The responsibility to proclaim the Gospel, spreading the light of Christ, begins in the family. *Gaudium et spes*, the *Pastoral Constitution in the Modern World*, states: "As a result, with their parents leading the way by example and family prayer, children and indeed everyone gathered around the family hearth will find a readier path to human maturity, salvation and holiness. Graced with the dignity and office of fatherhood and motherhood, parents will energetically acquit themselves of a duty which devolves primarily on them, namely education and especially religious education" (48).

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS

Our Lady's Church has now reopened for Public Worship, Private Prayer and Funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. It could be some time before we return to normal. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance to our Bishop, and he does not wish for anyone to be placed in vulnerable position of any kind. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament:

Mondays: 2pm – 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

As the colder autumn weather has now arrived, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 11.30am.

With restrictions on Masses and the difficulty of uniting with loved ones, remembering that Christmas is not just a single day feels more important than ever. The Feast of Christmas lasts for eight days – The Octave of Christmas. The Hill Mill Missionaries invite you to join us each day of the Octave of Christmas.
