Even though England is now in its third lockdown, our church building is able to open for public worship under Covid-secure conditions. Please wear a face covering when entering, use hand sanitiser and observe 2-metre social distancing for the safety and protection of all our church users. We are also open for private prayer: Monday 2pm-4pm and Thursday 10am-12noon.

Scripture Insights

Today's first reading, from the Book of Jonah, can easily give us the wrong impression of this prophet. Why? This selection provides the picture of a prophet who hears the Word of God and immediately responds to the Lord commands.

It is important for us to know that in the first three verses of the book, we hear God giving Jonah a more detailed command to preach against Ninevah. How does Jonah respond? He completely ignores this command and flees in the opposite direction! The material between Jonah's first and second command from the Lord is familiar to many. While on a ship during a storm, is swallowed by a large fish, and then prays to God, after which he is spewed onto dry land. Then, only then, do we hear today's reading that portrays Jonah as the obedient prophet. Interestingly, the psalm refrain "Lord, make me know your ways," would certainly have been an appropriate prayer for this prophet.

Our short passage from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians and the opening lines from Mark's Gospel continues with material not unlike what we heard from the Book of Jonah. Both of these excerpts can be referred to as "call narratives," texts, in which an individual or individuals are called by God and given a particular command. You may notice that Mark's call of Simon and Andrew (as well as James and John) is somewhat different from how John presented the call of these two men in last Sunday's Gospel.

Connections to the Church Teaching and Tradition

The Gospel portrays the disciples' first encounters with Jesus. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains that God continues to meet humankind in many ways (31-35) in the world (32) and in the human person (33).

In the Gospel, we see the beginning of Christ's years-long relationship with the disciples. Though we do not see Christ physically, he desires a relationship with us and for us to participate in his life. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains God allows us to come to know him through grace. The Catechism descibes grace as "the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God" (1996) and "a participation in the the life of God" (1997). It further states, "The peace of Christ is the gratitutous gift that God makes to us of his own life, infused by the Holy Spirit into our soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify it" (1999).

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS Our Lady's Church has now reopened for public worship, private prayer and funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. It could be some time before we return to normal. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance to our Bishop, and he does not wish for anyone to be placed in vulnerable position of any kind. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament:

Mondays: 2pm – 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

As the colder winter weather has now arrived, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 11.30am.
