Scripture Insights

The magnificent beginning of chapter 24 in the book of Ecclesiasticus sets the tone for this Sunday, which is one of awestruck wonder at the power of God. Psalm 147 is a festive response to the celebration of Wisdom, the mysterious presence at God's right hand. In a certain sense, the personification of Sophia a kind of companion to the Most High suggests the intimate relationship that the transcendent Hebrew God has with the depths of wisdom. Christians might read Jesus as the personification of wisdom, with some important differences, which will be clarified in the Prologue of John's Gospel. The Word (Logos) was present (though uncreated) at the dawn of time, collaborating in fashioning creation with the Eternal Father and, though like Wisdom dwelling in highest heaven, became flesh. The Word has made his home with humanity. A haunting line in this regard is in verses 6-7 from the book of Ecclesiasticus: "Over waves of the sea, over all land, over every people and nation I held sway. Among all these I sought a resting place; in whose inheritance should I abide?"

If we think of the Prologue of John's Gospel as a hymn, its contours become more lucid, its insights more penetrating. Clearly, the language in John allows for a kind of glorious praise enhancing the creation narrative itself in the book of Genesis, one that is now informed by the Word becoming flesh. In contrast to the First Reading, John substantiates not ethereal Wisdom, but the Word become Light in the world. Likewise, the presence of the Word engages testimony (from John the Baptist), which then lives among us in proclamation even though "His own people did not accept him." The plea from St Paul to the Ephesians, then, is for "a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him."

Connections to Church Teaching and Tradition

What does God show us about himself when he sends his Son to us?

Through Jesus Christ the invisible God becomes visible. He becomes a man like us. This shows us how far God's love goes: He bears our whole burden. He walks every path with us. He is there in our abandonment, our sufferings, our fear of death. He is there when we can go no further, so as to open for us the door leading into life. *Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church*

In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son. *Hebrews* 1:1-2

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS

Our Lady's Church has now reopened for Public Worship, Private Prayer and Funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. It could be some time before we return to normal. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance to our Bishop, and he does not wish for anyone to be placed in vulnerable position of any kind. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament:

Mondays: 2pm – 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

As the colder autumn weather has now arrived, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 11.30am.
