As the third lockdown in England continues, our church building is able to open for public worship under Covid-secure conditions. Please wear a face covering when entering, use hand sanitiser and observe 2-metre social distancing for the safety and protection of all our church users. We are also open for private prayer: Monday 2pm—4pm and Thursday 10am-12noon.

Scripture Insights

Three things are presented in the first reading. The conclusion of the Second Book of Chronicles contains a condensed account of the fall of Jerusalem, Israel's exile in Babylon, and the possibility of Israel's return to Judah. The Persian defeat of the Babylonians under King Cyrus brought an end to the exile and ushered in the period often referred to as "the restoration."

Psalm 136 provides insight into the exilic experience that was glossed over in the first reading. As the psalmist tells us, the Judeans were taunted by the Babylonians, who asked the exiles to sing songs from their homeland. The exiles refused to sing for their captors and instead held fast to their fond memories of Jerusalem as expressed in today's refrain: "O let my tongue cleave to my mouth if I remember you not!" This psalm is a lament, a song of longing for the world that the exiles had known prior to their defeat by the Babylonians.

Today's New Testament readings broaden our understanding of what it means to believe in Jesus, the Christ. Ephesians reminds us that God's mercy and grace are freely given to all who believe in Jesus and that our faith is a gift of God. While we know from the very first chapter of Genesis that we are made in the image and likeness of God, in Ephesians we hear that, in addition to

being God's "handiwork," we are created "in Christ Jesus" for good works. Meanwhile, the Gospel reminds us that the life we have in Jesus is eternal. If eternal life is desired, we must choose to walk in the light of God.

Connections to the Church Teaching and Tradition

The immenisty of God's love for us is hard to comprehend, but most can understand it would be difficult for a father to give up his son to the world. The Gospel according to John explains that God did this because he "so loved the world." In the encyclical *Deus caritas est*, Pope Benedict XVI reflects on how our belief in God's love changes us and that we become Christians through an encounter with God. The pope states: "We have come to believe in God's love: in these words the Christan can express the funamental decision of his life. Being Christian is . . . the result of . . .an encounter with an event, a person. . . Saint John's Gospel describes that event in these words: 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life" (1).

In the reading from the Gospel of John, we hear that God sent the light to the world and that whoever "lives by the truth comes out into the light." Through the light Christ offers, we come to know who God is. *Guadium et spes* explains, "The Word of God, through whom all things were made, became man and dwelt among us . . . He reveals to us that 'God is love'" (38).

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS

Our Lady's Church has now reopened for public worship, private prayer and funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament: Mondays: 2pm - 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 11.30am.
