for private prayer: Monday 2pm– 4pm and Thursday 10am -12noon. Scripture Insights

Today's passage tfrom Jeremiah tells of a covenant unlike what Israel has known. Whereas the Sinai covenant identified multiple stipulations that Israel was required to uphold, in this covenant Israel is passive. God would place this covenant within the heart of the people. Israel would receive this covenant freely. While similar images exist in a variety of texts in the Old Testament (for example, Ezekiel 11:19-20; 36:2; and Isaiah 42:9), nowhere else do we hear of a new covenant until we turn to the New Testament.

Psalm 51, often associated with King David, though not necessarily composed by him, is one of the better-known psalms of the psalter and certainly one of the best known of the seven penitential psalms. The refrain "a pure heart create for me, O God" is a plea for newness. The heart, in Hebrew anthropology, was the most vital of all organs. It also was understood to be the place where discernment took place and where decisions were made.

As the liturgical year draws closer to the celebration of the Triduum, the New Testament readings bring our attention to the death of Jesus. In the Letter to the Hebrews, Jesus' humanity is detailed. He was a being who prayed, cried, learned, and

suffered. In the Gospel, Jesus states, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified," indicating that the time of his suffering, death, and resurrection is at hand.

Connections to the Church Teaching and Tradition

At the end of today's Gospel reading, Jesus says that when he is "lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." In the liturgy, the Church offers God's reconciling love as the paschal mystery is celebrated. The *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* states:"recalling thus the mysteries of redemption, the Church opens up to the faithful the riches of the Lord's powers and merits, so that these are in some way made present in every age in order that the faithful may lay hold on them and be filled with saving grace" (102).

In the Gospel reading from John, we hear Jesus say that the "hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." During the Sacred Paschal Triduum, the Church gathers to celebrate the holiest days of the year, recalling Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. *Paschalie solemnitatis* explains, "The greatst mysteries of the redemption are celebrated yearly by the Church beginning with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until Vespers of Easter Sunday. This time is called 'the triduum of the crucified, buried and riesen'; it is also called the 'Easter triduum' because during it is celebrated the paschal mystery, that is, the passing of the Lord from this world to his Father. The Church, by the celebration of this mystery through liturgical signs and scaramentals, is united to Christ, her spouse, in intimate communion" (83).

REOPENING OF OUR LADY'S CHURCH FOR MASS Our Lady's Church has now reopened for public worship, private prayer and funerals. You are reminded that the dispensation for not attending Sunday Mass, granted by the Bishops, is still in force, so there is no obligation to parishioners to attend a Sunday Mass. The safety of everyone is of paramount importance. Outside of public liturgies advertised, you are invited to come and spend time in private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament: Mondays: 2pm - 4pm and Thursdays: 10am to 12noon. I am grateful to those who have volunteered to act as stewards to ensure that we have a prayerful environment in the church and keep everyone safe by doing all we can to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Please register your name and phone number for contact tracing or use the QR code with the NHS app, and follow the guidance of our stewards. We are now required to wear face coverings when inside places of worship. We do need more volunteers as stewards to cover the times the church is open for private prayer.

The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Penance** or **Confession** will be celebrated in the Sacristy on Saturdays between 10.30am and 11.30am.
