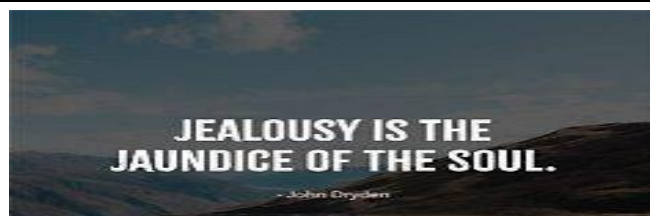
Chiltern Foodbank: They most need tinned vegetables and fruit, long-life milk, pasta sauces, and washing powder.

Adoremus: The Diocese of Northampton will be represented at Adoremus on **Saturday 10 October**, as Catholics from across England and Wales gather in prayer and celebration at St George's Cathedral, Southwark, and Westminster Cathedral. The Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill: was defeated at its Second Reading in the House of Commons on 11 September, with MPs voting 286 against and 270 in favour. The Bill would have provided a legal framework for eligible terminally ill adults in England and Wales to request assistance to end their own lives, subject to proposed safeguards. The vote means the legislation will not proceed through Parliament in its current form.
